Focus on Committees

NGEAO Education Committee's Goals and Recent Activities

The NGEAO Education Committee for 2009 has been organized! Kristin Mackey, Alyn Williams, Bill Shanahan, Debbie Lessert and Rick Fitzgerald (2008 Committee Chair) will serve on the Committee. Their 2009 goals include 1) To coordinate between OU, OSU and TU energy management students and their directors to help current students create professional relationships in the energy industry and 2) To provide education opportunities for our NGEAO members and the energy industry as needed.

The Education Committee has been in close contact with energy program directors at The University of Oklahoma, Oklahoma State University and The University of Tulsa. Students from all three schools regularly attend the monthly NGEAO luncheons with their program directors. The Education Committee encourages NGEAO members to make an effort to take the time to introduce themselves and welcome the visiting students at the luncheons. A mentoring program for college students has been discussed by the board at some length and will be reported upon as things progress with the universities.

The NGEAO Education Committee has recently collaborated with the Oklahoma Energy Resources Board (OERB) to discuss opportunities to create classes in natural gas scheduling and contract administration. In 2008, the committee worked with Landy Thompson of OERB to create an outline for potential curriculum for the classes. The committee met with Tulsa and Oklahoma City natural gas scheduling and contracts energy professionals to collaborate on the curriculum outline. The committee is currently looking for instructors to potentially lead the classes and provide the curriculum for classes to eventually be held in Oklahoma City.

In addition, the NGEAO Education Committee helped support a wellhead to burner tip class in Tulsa in February. Feedback from the class was excellent and there were requests for more classes in risk management and contract administration. The NGEAO board will discuss any future opportunities to serve our membership's education needs. Well Site Safety

On February 8, 2009, a teenage boy in Oklahoma City was seriously injured after climbing a fence and trying to ride a pumping unit. Because of accidents like this one, OERB created a well site safety education program in 1996.

Since then, the OERB has reached thousands of students around the state by providing safety folders, activity books and posters free of charge to teachers to hand out to their students on a yearly basis.

OERB's Petro Pros program allows professionals in the oil and natural gas industry to bring a one-hour presentation to classrooms statewide. The presentation includes important information about well site safety and provides students with firsthand accounts of the dangers that can be found around oilfield equipment. Petro Pros also provide the students with OERB's "What's the Risk?" DVD, along with information about how oil and natural gas is formed, explored and produced.

On April 24th, the OERB will host its annual "Well Site Safety Day" at the state capitol. This day includes showcasing the winners of a statewide poster contest for grades three through six and providing teachers with materials needed to teach well site safety in their classrooms.
