
Did You Know?

Education Dollars Well Spent

The NGEAO board of directors voted to allocate \$8000 of the education budget for 2008 to sponsor a Natural Gas 101 class for new members. The class was a one day seminar and was a cooperative effort of NGEAO and Energy Seminars, Inc. The cost of the seminar was \$200 per person, which was a substantial savings over the normal rate of \$700 and NGEAO paid 50% of that cost. In addition, each student was given a free membership to NGEAO through 6/30/2008, natural gas reference materials, an NGEAO membership directory, and access to email notifications of meetings and events.

This class was an overwhelming success as 80 registered students attended in what was otherwise considered a "bad weather day" for Tulsa. Many thanks go to Mr. Steve Reese and Energy Seminars, Inc. for making this class possible at such an affordable rate. NGEAO has received positive feedback from both the students and their employers and many of the students expressed an interest in volunteering for future NGEAO events.
